

REACH REGULATION

Braude have set up a team to evaluate the implications of REACH regulations on our manufacturing of products.

One of the requirements of REACH is that manufacturers and importers of chemicals/substances have a duty to register substances on their own, or in preparations that they produce or import into the EU in quantities over one tonne per year (per manufacturer / importer), unless the substance is exempt from registration. Registration requirements also apply to substances designed to be intentionally released from articles under certain conditions, in which case the article producer/importer is responsible for the registration.

Braude is an article manufacturer and does not prepare or manufacture substances or import over one tonne pa of individual substances, and as such is considered to be a downstream user, furthermore no substances are intentionally released from our articles. Braude therefore is not required to register any substances under the regulation.

We employ a process of verification with our suppliers that they have registered any relevant substances and that there will be no disruption to the supply chain.

If we become aware of any difficulties as a result of the REACH regulations that will affect our ability to supply our products, we will inform our customers and advise what remedial measures are being taken.
